Boudoir Hanover (Captaintreacherous-Bedroomconfessions-American Ideal)



Boudoir Hanover finished sixth in the one Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination. She is a daughter of Captaintreacherous, who was third in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace final in 2012 and won the 3-Year-Old Colt Pace final the next year. Her dam Bedroomconfessions was a three-time Breeders Crown participant. She was third in the 2015 3-Year-Old Filly Pace final, sixth in the 2016 Open Mare Pace final, and the runner-up in the 2017 Open Mare Pace final. Boudoir Hanover is this year's fastest 2-year-old pacing filly by virtue of her 1:49.4 victory in a Bluegrass Series division at The Red Mile. She also won one leg of the Kentucky Championship Series. She'll be one of three in the final for trainer Tony Alagna. Alagna captured the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final in 2019 with Reflect With Me. Alagna's Visionary Breeders bred Boudoir Hanover with Myron and Stephanie Bell's Riverview Breeding (they also campaigned and bred Bedroomconfessions), and they co-own her via their respective racing stables in partnership with Caviart Farms (Buck and Judy Chaffee) and D Plouffe and S Head (Daniel Plouffe and Steven Head). She did go through the 2020 Standardbred Horse Sale, fetching \$200,000.



Captain Cowgirl (Captaintreacherous-Rideintothesunset-Western Hanover)

Captain Cowgirl advanced to the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final by finishing seventh in the elimination. She is a daughter of Captaintreacherous, who was third in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace final in 2012 and won the 3-Year-Old Colt Pace final the next year. Captain Cowgirl has six wins from nine starts in 2021. She won two legs and the

Championship in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes, and also won a division of the Liberty Bell. She is trained by Jim King Jr., best known as the conditioner of 2019 Horse of the Year Shartin N. Captain Cowgirl is one of two he will send out in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final. Captain Cowgirl is owned by Kenneth Frieder and Jo Ann Looney-King, Jim King Jr.'s wife. Bred by Kentuckiana Farms and Pinske Stables, she was a \$20,000 buy at last year's Standardbred Horse Sale. Kentuckiana Farms has collected eight Breeders Crown trophies as winning breeder, but she is Pinske Stables' first Breeders Crown finalist as a breeder.



Dont Fence Me In (Captaintreacherous-Mystery Game-Artistic Fella)

Dont Fence Me In moved on to the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final after her connections accepted a bye. She is a daughter of Captaintreacherous, who was third in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace final in 2012 and won the 3-Year-Old Colt Pace final the next year. Dont Fence Me In hasn't missed the board in nine starts in 2021 (4-4-1 record). She won a leg of the Kindergarten Series and two rounds and the final of the Kentucky Championship Series. She tackled Grand Circuit company both weeks in Lexington, finishing second and third. She is one of three finalists that will be sent out by trainer Tony Alagna in the 2-Year-Old Filly Pace. Alagna won this event with Reflect With Me in 2019. She was bred by Riverview Breeding (Myron and Stephanie Bell), and is their second finalist, joining Boudoir Hanover. The Bells are also co-owners through their Riverview Racing entity, along with Alagna Racing LLC., Steven Head, and Jerry Glantz. Head also co-owns Boudoir Hanover. **Galleria Hanover (Always B Miki-Gallie Bythe Beach-Somebeachsomewhere)**



Galleria Hanover secured her spot in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final by finishing eighth in the elimination. She is a daughter of Always B Miki, who captured the 2015 and 2016 Breeders Crown Open Pace finals. She has one win in eight starts but has hit the board on four other occasions, including in her Bluegrass Series division at The Red Mile. She will be one of two starters for trainer Ron Burke in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final. Burke is the second-most successful trainer in Crown history in terms of trophies (18) and earnings (\$10.2 million), trailing only Jimmy Takter. He has won the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace on two occasions (2017, Youaremycandygirl & 2018, Warrawee Ubeaut). She is owned by W.J. Donovan, Purnel & Libby LLC. (Purnel and Elizabeth Jones), and Joe Sbrocco. Donovan was also the winning owner with Youaremycandygirl. Galleria Hanover was bred by Fashion Farms (Jules Siegel) and sold for \$130,000 at last year's Standardbred Horse Sale. Fashion Farms LLC. has bred two Breeders Crown champions, and Siegel bred two others with his late wife, Arlene. Galleria Hanover's dam Gallie Bythe Beach won eliminations for both the 2013 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace and the 2014 3-Year-Old Filly Pace, but missed both finals. She came up sore after the race in 2013 and was sick the next year.



Gotthegreenlight (American Ideal-Bet On Luck-Bettor's Delight)

Gotthegreenlight was the fourth-place finisher in the single Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination. She is by American Ideal, who finished second in his elimination and seventh in the final of the 2005 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt Pace. Gotthegreenlight has eight wins and a second from 10 starts in an excellent season thus far. She's also won at four different tracks. She won two legs and the final of the New York Sire Stakes, divisions of the Home Grown and Renaissance in New Jersey (Meadowlands and Freehold), and two Kindergarten Classic rounds. Trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman won the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Pace final last year with eventual Dan Patch Award recipient Fire Start Hanover. She is owned by Patricia Stable (Harvey Fried) and Kovach Stables LLC. (Jan and Jerry Kovach). Both owners are after their first Breeders Crown trophy. Gotthegreenlight was bred by the late Dr. Stephen Dey and sold for \$40,000 at the 2020 Standardbred Horse Sale.

Lyons Serenity (Sweet Lou-Southwind Serenity-Real Desire)



Lyons Serenity was the other horse in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace to take a bye straight to the final. Lyons Serenity's sire, Sweet Lou, raced in the Breeders Crown four times. He was the winner of the 2011 2-Year-Old Colt Pace, second in the 2012 3-Year-Old Colt Pace, sixth in the 2013 Open Pace, and the runner-up in the 2014 Open Pace. Lyons Serenity had a six-race winning streak from July to September that included two legs and the final of the Pennsylvania Stallion Series, divisions of the Arden Downs and Keystone Classic, and the Kentuckiana Stallion Management. She is the second finalist for trainer Jim King Jr., the conditioner of 2019 Horse of the Year Shartin N. Owned by Threelyonsracing (Geoffrey Lyons-Mound, Geoffrey F. Lyons-Mound, and Joseph Lyons-Mound), she was bred by Southwind Farms and was a \$35,000 purchase at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Threelyonsracing and King Jr. were second together with Lyons Serenity in both the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace and 3-Year-Old Filly Pace with Lyons Sentinel in 2019 and 2020, and she advanced to this year's Open Mare Pace final. Southwind Farms has been the winning breeder in a Breeders Crown final on three occasions.

Niki Hill (Always B Miki-Road Bet-Bettor's Delight)



Niki Hill was the runner-up in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination, suffering her first defeat after starting six-for-six. She is a daughter of Always B Miki, who captured the 2015 and 2016 Breeders Crown Open Pace finals. Niki Hill's six victories are comprised of two rounds of the Kindergarten Classic, a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes leg, her elimination and the final of the She's A Great Lady, and a split of the International Stallion Series. Niki Hill will attempt to join Youaremycandygirl (2017) and JK She'salady (2014) in winning both the She's A Great Lady and the Breeders Crown in the same season. Campaigns for the same connections - trainer Chris Ryder and owner Tom Hill - as the brilliant filly Party Girl Hill, who went 15-for-16 in 2020. Her lone defeat came in the final of the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace, as she was third. Niki Hill was bred by the late Dr. Stephen P. Dey (his second finalist in the race) and cost \$155,000 at the 2020 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. She is a half-sister to Cattlewash, who was third in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace in 2018, third in the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt Pace last year, and is in this year's Breeders Crown Open Pace.



Queen Of Success (Captaintreacherous-Cashaway-Western Ideal)

Queen Of Success was the winner of the lone Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination, tallying in 1:50.3 at odds of 23-1. She is a daughter of Captaintreacherous, who was third in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace final in 2012 and won the 3-Year-Old Colt Pace final the next year. Queen Of Success won four legs of the Kentucky Commonwealth Series at The Red Mile but skipped the final to race in the She's A Great Lady. She advanced to the final but finished tenth. She then went back to Kentucky and was second in a division of the International Stallion Series. She is one of three finalists in this race for trainer Tony Alagna, who won the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace with Reflect With Me in 2019. Queen Of Success is owned by Alagna Racing LLC., Caviart Farms (Buck and Judy Chaffee), and Robert Leblanc. Caviart Farms also co-owns Alagna-trained Boudoir Hanover in this event, and Leblanc was part of the winning ownership group with Alagna-trained Ramona Hill in the 2019 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Trot. Queen Of Success, a \$45,000 buy at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, was bred by Brittany Farms and Marvin Katz. Brittany Farms is tied with Hanover Shoe Farms for most trophies by a breeder in Crown history (27) and is second all-time in earnings. Katz has four Crown trophies as a breeder.

Sea Silk (Downbytheseaside-Silk Purse-Bettor's Delight)



Sea Silk took third in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination, and like Niki Hill saw her undefeated run ended after starting her career nine-for-nine. Sea Silk is a filly from the first crop of Downbytheseaside, who was second in both the 2016 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace final and the 2017 3-Year-Old Colt Pace final. Sea Silk went eight-for-eight in Ohio, including a Triple Crown season (victories in the State Fair, Sire Stakes championship, and Breeders Championship). She then captured a division of the Bluegrass at The Red Mile. She will be one of two starters for trainer Ron Burke in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final. Burke is the second-most successful trainer in Crown history in terms of trophies (18) and earnings (\$10.2 million), trailing only Jimmy Takter. He has won the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace on two occasions (2017, Youaremycandygirl & 2018, Warrawee Ubeaut). Sea Silk is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC. (Sylvia Burke), Weaver Bruscemi LLC. (Mark Weaver and Michael Bruscemi), Knox Services Inc. (Carolyn Brechler), and Hatfield Stables (Bud Hatfield). Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Bruscemi LLC. are the second- and third-winningest owners in Breeders Crown history in terms of trophies (13 for Burke Racing and 12 for Weaver Bruscemi) and earnings (\$7.7 million for Burke Racing and \$6.8 million for Weaver Bruscemi). Bud Hatifeld also has a pair of Breeders Crown trophies, winning the 2016 3-Year-Old Colt Trot with Bar Hopping and last year's Open Mare Pace with Kissin In The Sand. Sea Silk was bred by Steiner Stock Farm, who is in search of their first Breeders Crown title, and brought \$47,000 at the 2020 Ohio Selected Jug Sale.

Treacherous Dragon (Captaintreacherous-My Little Dragon-Dragon Again)



Treacherous Dragon moved on to the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final by finishing fifth in the elimination. She is a daughter of Captaintreacherous, who was third in the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace final in 2012 and won the 3-Year-Old Colt Pace final the next year. Treacherous Dragon has three wins, taking a division of the Reynolds, a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes leg, and a round of the Kindergarten Classic. Her dam My Little Dragon raced in the Breeders Crown four times. She won the 2005 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final, took the 2006 3-Year-Old Filly Pace final, was eighth in the 2007 Open Mare Pace, and added a third trophy in the 2008 Open Mare Pace. My Little Dragon would then go on to throw Stay Hungry, the champion of the 2017 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace final. Treacherous Dragon is trained by Brett Pelling, who won the 1998 2-Year-Old Filly Pace final with Juliet's Fate. Treacherous Dragon was bred by White Birch Farm and was purchased for \$260,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. She is owned by Hot Lead Farm LLC. (Joseph Parisi). The Parisis operated White Birch Farm, which won seven trophies in the Breeders Crown.
