In harness racing, it all comes down to the Breeders Crown.

BEAUTYONTHEBEACH

(bay filly, 3, Somebeachsomewhere – Precocious Beauty – Art Major)

Owners: James L. Avritt Sr., Lebanon, Kentucky

Trainer: Gregg McNair

Driver: Doug McNair

Breeder: James Avritt

Beautyonthebeach showed speed from post ten, stalked the leaders after yielding, and came in fourth at odds of 79-1 in the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination. She finished 6 1/2 lengths behind winner Warrawee Ubeaut and was timed in 1:51.4.

Beautyonthebeach was third in her elimination and fourth in the final of the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace last year. This year she swept through the Kentucky Sires Stakes at The Red Mile, winning all three legs and the \$250,000 final.

A homebred for Lebanon, Kentucky's Jim Avritt, she would be his first Breeders Crown champion as either an owner or a breeder. As a breeder he has a best finish of second with Sportswriter in the 2009 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace. His best result as an owner was a third with Prescient Beauty in last year's Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace.

Beautyonthebeach's dam Precocious Beauty was a two-time Breeders Crown finalist, finishing eighth in the 2-Year-Old Filly Pace in 2013 and fifth in the 3-Year-Old Filly Pace in 2014. Beautyonthebeach is a half-sister to Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace finalist Tall Dark Stranger.

Longtime Ontario-based trainer Gregg McNair is also looking for his initial Breeders Crown trophy. He was second at Mohawk in the 2000 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace with George Scooter, finishing behind Gallo Blue Chip.

Doug McNair, 28, won his first Breeders Crown in 2017 with Stay Hungry in the final for 2-year-old male pacers. He drove in one final in 2018, finishing third with 2-year-old filly pacer Prescient Beauty.

In May, McNair was one of two Canadian representatives (with defending champion James MacDonald) in the World Driving Championship in Sweden. McNair finished fourth.

McNair received the 2017 O'Brien Award for Canada's Driver of the Year. McNair, who was a finalist for the honor in 2013, was the top driver on the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) circuit. He led all drivers in Canada with \$5.92 million in purses and was third in wins with 318.

He was the regular driver of 2017 O'Brien Award winners Stay Hungry, Bettor's Up, and Sandbetweenurtoes, and drove Dr J Hanover to the fastest mile in Canadian history, 1:46.4 at Mohawk.

McNair started driving in 2008 and has won at least \$1 million in purses every year of his career. He was the youngest driver to earn \$1 million, at the age of 18, and in 2010 became, at the time, the youngest driver to 1,000 wins. He has won more than 3,300 races in his career and \$49 million in purses.

BESTSELLER HANOVER

(bay filly, 3, Somebeachsomewhere – Bittersweet Terror – Western Terror)

Owners: Millar Farms, Stouffville, Ontario (George Millar Jr.)

Dismissed at 109-1, Bestseller Hanover sprinted home in 26 seconds to go from tenth at three-quarters to seventh at the finish line and advance to the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace final from the lone elimination. She was nine lengths behind winner Warrawee Ubeaut and was timed in 1:52.2.

Bestseller Hanover is making her first appearance in the Breeders Crown. She won this year's Lismore at Yonkers Raceway, was third in the Lady Maud, which was also at Yonkers, and was fourth in the Jugette final at the Delaware County Fair after coming in third in her elimination.

Bestseller Hanover is just the second Breeders Crown finalist for owner Millar Farms. They were eighth in the 2001 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace final with Northern Accord.

She's the first Breeders Crown participant for trainer Scott Blackler. A Maine native, Blackler races mainly at Yonkers Raceway.

Scott Zeron, 30, won his first Breeders Crown in 2016 with Call Me Queen Be in the final for 3-year-old female pacers. He won a second trophy in 2018 with 2-year-old male pacer Captain Crunch.

Captain Crunch was the 2018 Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male pacer.

In June 2019, Zeron won his first North America Cup with Captain Crunch at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

In August 2018, Zeron drove Atlanta to victory in the \$1 million Hambletonian Stakes, the sport's premier event for 3-year-old trotters. Atlanta became the first female to win the Hambletonian since Continentalvictory in 1996. She was named 2018 Trotter of the Year in Dan Patch Award voting.

In 2016, Zeron won the Trotting Triple Crown (Hambletonian, Yonkers Trot, Kentucky Futurity) with Marion Marauder, who was named Trotter of the Year. The then 27-year-old Zeron was the second-youngest driver to win the Hambletonian and youngest driver to win a harness racing Triple Crown, either trotting or pacing.

Zeron was born in Montreal and made a name for himself in Ontario, twice leading all Canadian drivers in wins (2010 and 2011) before relocating to the U.S. near the end of 2013. In 2012, he received the Rising Star Award from the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

Breeder Hanover Shoe Farms Inc. has the most champions (22), trophies (25), and earnings (\$16,898,036) in the history of the Breeders Crown. Bestseller Hanover's dam Bittersweet Terror is a half-sister to Cam Swifty, champion of the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace in 2001 at Woodbine.

IDEATION HANOVER

(bay filly, 3, Bettor's Delight – Ideal Weather – Western Ideal)

Ideation Hanover followed along on the inside in mid-pack throughout and advanced to the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace final with a fifth-place finish in the lone elimination. She crossed the finish line 7 1/2 lengths behind winner Warrawee Ubeaut and was timed in 1:52 flat.

Ideation Hanover will be making her first appearance in a Breeders Crown final. She has one stakes victory this year, that coming in an Ontario Sires Stakes Grassroots Series leg at Woodbine Mohawk Park. She was second in her elimination and the final of the Jugette at the Delaware County Fair.

She would be the first Breeders Crown winner for her Ontario-based ownership group of Larry Menary, Michael Guerriero, and Alan Alber.

Dave Menary, 40, is looking for his first Breeders Crown. He has finished third on three occasions.

For his career, Menary has won nearly 800 races and \$18 million in purses. He won the 2014 Meadowlands Pace with He's Watching, in a world-record-equaling 1:46.4 performance.

Menary's father was a truck operator and part-time trainer in the 1970s. When Menary was 13, he dipped into his savings and bought a horse with his dad, which fueled his passion for harness racing. Menary went to college to get a business and administration degree but turned to racing after a year.

James MacDonald, 33, has raced in two Breeders Crown finals, most recently finishing seventh with 3-year-old filly trotter Dewdle All Day in 2016. MacDonald got career win 2,000 on May 13 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. He has added nearly 100 victories since then. He has earned more than \$26 million in lifetime purses and is in his sixth consecutive year among the top 10 drivers in Canadian earnings.

In 2017, MacDonald represented Canada in the World Driving Championship. He won the championship, which was hosted in his home country. Earlier this year, he competed in Sweden to defend the title and finished ninth.

MacDonald's brothers Mark and Anthony also are successful drivers. Mark has won more than 6,000 career races and was Canada's Driver of the Year in 2005 and 2006 before relocated to the U.S. while Anthony has more than 3,000 victories.

Breeder Hanover Shoe Farms Inc. has the most champions (22), trophies (25), and earnings (\$16,898,036) in the history of the Breeders Crown. Ideation Hanover's dam Ideal Weather was a two-time Breeders Crown participant. She won her elimination at odds of 15-1 and was seventh in the final of the 2007 Mare Pace, then came back to finish fifth in the 2008 Mare Pace.

PHILLY HANOVER

(bay filly, 3, Captaintreacherous – Paris Hanover – Camluck)

Philly Hanover finished third in the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination. Fifth at three-quarters, she closed in 26.2 to finish 6 1/4 lengths behind winner Warrawee Ubeaut, and she completed the mile in 1:51.4.

Philly Hanover will be making her Breeders Crown debut. She has two stakes wins this year, both of which came in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes program. She was third in the PaSS Championship and raced in the Mistletoe Shalee and the J.M. Lynch Memorial.

Would be the first Breeders Crown champion for owners Ron Coyne Stables Inc. and Blair Corbeil.

Coyne is in search of his initial Breeders Crown success as a trainer as well. Two of his horses have made finals (Ozone Blue Chip, 2016 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace and Rockingcam Park, 2013 2-Year-Old Filly Pace), with both of them finishing seventh in their respective races.

Louis-Philippe Roy, 29, made his Breeders Crown debut in 2017 and finished third with Pink Pistol in the Mare Trot.

Roy spent six years competing, and dominating, on the Quebec fair circuit before making a name for himself at Hippodrome 3R (Trois-Rivières), which propelled him to regular drives on the Woodbine-Mohawk/Ontario circuit.

He was named Canada's Driver of the Year in 2018. He led all Canadian drivers in purses with \$6.79 million and wins with 413. This year, he is battling Sylvain Filion for the top spot in earnings and is second in victories.

Roy won 380 races in 2017, good for second among all drivers in Canada, and earned \$5.74 million in purses and was a finalist for Canada's Driver of the Year, which ultimately went to Doug McNair.

In 2016, he won the Gold Cup & Saucer with YS Lotus on Prince Edward Island and received Canada's Future Star Award. For his career, Roy has won more than 1,400 races and \$16 million.

Roy is a graduate of the University of Quebec at Rimouski. For the first two years of his driving career, he also worked as a financial analyst for a telecommunications company.

Breeder Hanover Shoe Farms Inc. has the most champions (22), trophies (25), and earnings (\$16,898,036) in the history of the Breeders Crown. Philly Hanover is a half-sister to Panera Hanover, the dam of Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace elimination winner Papi Rob Hanover.

QUEEN OF THE PRIDE

(bay filly, 3, McArdle – Lionness Hanover – Western Ideal)

Queen Of The Pride had a first-over trip, got up to third at three-quarters, then faded through the last quarter to finish sixth in the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination. She was eight lengths behind winner Warrawee Ubeaut and finished the mile in 1:52.1.

Queen Of The Pride was third in her elimination and eighth in the final of the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace. This year she won the Ohio Sires Stakes Championship, multiple legs of that event, and a division of the Reynolds at Yonkers Raceway.

Owner Frank Chick, a long-time harness racing participant from Delaware, is in search of his initial Breeders Crown success. His best finish so far is a fourth with the Kevin Lare-trained Roaring To Go in the 2016 2-Year-Old Filly Pace. Roaring To Go, who won her elimination in 2016, is a half-sister to Queen Of The Pride.

Kevin Lare, a mainstay on the Mid-Atlantic circuit for many years, will be looking for his second Breeders Crown champion, having captured the 2007 2-Year-Old Filly Trot with Snow White.

Brian Sears, 51, leads all active drivers in wins in the Breeders Crown, with 30, and is tied with Ron Pierce for the second-most trophies in the history of the series. Sears trails only John Campbell (48).

Sears won three Breeders Crown finals in 2018. His triumphs came with 2-year-old male trotter Gimpanzee, 3-year-old male trotter Tactical Landing, and older male pacer McWicked. McWicked was the 2018 Horse of the Year in both the U.S. and Canada and Gimpanzee received the Dan Patch Award for best 2-year-old male trotter.

Sears got his first Breeders Crown trophy with 3-year-old female trotter Stroke Play in 2003. He won a total of 19 trophies in the next six years. He won four Crowns in each 2004 and 2005, and three in each 2006, 2008 and 2009. He had two victories in 2007.

In July 2017, Sears was inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in Goshen, N.Y. A native of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., Sears is a third-generation horseman, following in the footsteps of his grandfather Gene and dad Jay. Both are in the Florida Harness Racing Hall of Fame. For his career, Sears has won more than 10,100 races and \$194 million in purses. He ranks 17th in North American history for wins among drivers and fifth in purses. He led the sport in earnings in 2005, with a then-record \$15 million, and has finished among the top 10 in purses in 13 of the past 15 years.

Queen Of The Pride became the first Breeders Crown participant for breeder Bradley A. Wallace when she raced in the event last year.

STONEBRIDGE SOUL

(bay filly, 3, Somebeachsomewhere – Rock N Soul – Rocknroll Hanover)

Stonebridge Soul got the last spot in the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace final by finishing eighth in the elimination. She took back from post two, stayed on the inside near the back of the pack, and out-finished other horses to come in nine lengths behind winner Warrawee Ubeaut in a 1:52.2 performance.

Stonebridge Soul is making her first appearance in the Breeders Crown. She won this year's J.M. Lynch Memorial and a PA All-Stars division at Pocono, the Mistletoe Shalee at the Meadowlands, and an Adioo Volo split at The Meadows.

Co-owner Craig Henderson of Henderson Farms co-owned 2010 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace champion Put On A Show. She would be the first Breeders Crown winner for co-owner Robert Mondillo.

Chris Ryder, 64, has won four Breeders Crown finals. He won his first two with Mystical Sunshine, in the 2006 and 2007 Mare Trot, followed by 3-year-old female pacer Put On A Show in 2010 and 3-year-old female pacer I Luv The Nitelife in 2013.

Ryder grew up in New Zealand and began riding ponies at the age of 10. His father was a dairy farmer who later worked at a stable and trained horses. Ryder worked for his father and older brother, who had a stable, before a stint in Montreal as a groom.

He came to the U.S. when his wife, Nicola, got a job in the New York area. Ryder worked several odd jobs before turning to training on a fulltime basis.

Tim Tetrick, 37, is fourth among active drivers in Breeders Crown wins, with 20, and is No. 7 all time in the series. He won two finals last year, the Mare Pace with Shartin N and the 3-year-old filly trot with Lily Stride.

In 2016, Tetrick won three trophies, with Huntsville in the final for 2-year-old male pacers, Walner in the final for 2-year-old male trotters, and Bar Hopping in the final for 3-year-old male trotters. Tetrick won a career-high four Breeders Crown trophies in 2012 at Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto.

For his career, Tetrick ranks No. 4 all time in purses with \$215 million and No. 9 in wins with more than 11,200. As of Oct. 16, he was within \$110,000 of moving past Ron Pierce for third on the earnings list.

Angie Stiller has bred and co-owned one Breeders Crown champion - Peaceful Way in the 2005 Mare Trot. The dam Rock N Soul was a two-time Breeders Crown finalist, finishing second to Put On A Show in the 2010 3-Year-Old Filly Pace and sixth in the 2011 Mare Pace.

SUNNY DEE

(bay filly, 3, Sunshine Beach – West Of L A – Western Hanover)

Unraced as a two-year-old, Sunny Dee debuted on January 17 with a 1:56 victory at Woodbine Mohawk Park. She proceeded to win in her next seven starts—including the elimination and final of the Ontario SBOA Stakes.

"She's phenomenal," trainer Bob McIntosh said after winning the Ontario SBOA final. "Last year she was extra special, but unfortunately she kicked a stall wall and cracked her coffin bone or else you would have a lot from her last year. But she's come back and made amends for that this year. I couldn't ask for much more—I know it's going to get much, much tougher—but I've got a lot of faith in this filly. She's not going to win every time, but I wouldn't trade her for anything I can think of."

Though Sunny Dee did not make the final of the Fan Hanover, she rebounded the next week as the odds-on favourite to win the \$35,000 consolation. She ground a living through the rest of the summer in the Ontario Sires Stakes before finishing second in the \$225,000 Super Final to Boadicea, who supplemented to the Breeders Crown but failed to qualify for the final.

Sunny Dee did not race in the Breeders Crown eliminations as she received a bye. The other bye into the race is Treacherous Reign.

Trainer Bob McIntosh has won many Breeders Crown finals—earning \$6.4 million in the event—including thrice in the Three-Year-Old Filly Pace. His most recent Breeders Crown victory came in 2014 with Thinking Out Loud in the Open Pace. His most recent Breeders Crown finalist was L A Delight in the 2017 Mares Pace, finishing seventh. He last won in this division in 2005 with Belovedangel.

Mohawk-based driver Trevor Henry makes his first start in a Breeders Crown final. He has previously steered Keystone Paula in a 2015 elimination for the Two-Year-Old Filly Pace and Percy Bluechip in a 2017 elimination for the Two-Year-Old Filly Pace. Henry started his career on the smaller tracks in Ontario but in 2015 fully transitioned to racing on the Woodbine-Mohawk circuit.

Robert McIntosh has yet to breed a Breeders Crown winner. However C S X Stable tries for its second victory as a breeder with its first coming in 2014 with Thinking Out Loud.

TALL DRINK HANOVER

(bay filly, 3, Captaintreacherous – Take Into Account – The Panderosa)

Tall Drink Hanover was second to Warrawee Ubeaut in the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination. She finished two lengths behind the winner and was clocked in 1:51 flat.

Tall Drink Hanover raced in last year's Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace. She won her elimination and then was seventh in the final. This year she has wins in the Simcoe, Shady Daisy, Pennsylvania Sire Stakes program, and a division of the Adioo Volo.

Co-owner Marvin Katz has claimed ten Breeders Crown trophies. Riverview Racing (Myron and Stephanie Bell) was part of the ownership group of 2013 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace champion Captaintreacherous. Tony Alagna's Alagna Racing LLC. has not yet won a Breeders Crown event.

In addition to a prolific racing stable, Katz and his partner Al Libfeld have accumulated a blue-ribbon broodmare band that has produced one stellar trotting champion after another.

This year they stepped to the forefront when the Breeders Crown came to their home province of Ontario and became presenting sponsors of the Breeders Crown at Woodbine Mohawk Park. It was their intention to make the event an unparalleled success after the Crown's 11-year absence from the Campbellville racetrack.

"We started meeting on this year in Toronto, the week after the Breeders Crown at Pocono," said Katz. I've given a lot of thought to this."

"The corporate part was the easiest one to establish right away. Katz-Libfeld is essentially right there anyway, so that worked. We're the primary sponsor. I want this to be a really big deal. We need an expanded footprint. This is to be a social engagement. We want to set the bar for others," he continued.

"Tracks are not corporate allies with their communities and we wanted that to change. Corporations must be giving back to their communities. The community benefits, the political parties benefit.

Katz-Libfeld put together an auction of elite stallion breedings and convinced the connections of the 2018 freshman Breeders Crown champions to donate 1% donated by all the participants. The results were a resounding success.

"We're on course for the highest charitable donation ever-including thoroughbreds, in the history of Woodbine/Mohawk," stated Katz.

Tony Alagna, 47, is a three-time Breeders Crown winner. He got his most recent trophy in 2017 with Stay Hungry in the 2-year-old colt-and-gelding pace. Stay Hungry received the O'Brien Award as Canada's best 2-year-old male pacer. Alagna got his first Crown with 3-year-old male pacer Captaintreacherous in 2013 and added his second with 3-year-old male pacer Racing Hill in 2016.

Andrew McCarthy, 33, is seeking his first Breeders Crown trophy. He finished second each of the past two years with female pacer Caviart Ally; in 2017 in the division for 3-year-old filly pacers and in 2018 in the Mare Pace. He also has two third-place finishes in the series. McCarthy has seen his purse earnings increase annually since the start of 2013, reaching \$6.17 million in 2018. For his career, he has won \$43 million in purses and more than 2,300 races.

He has enjoyed success at Woodbine Mohawk Park, winning this year's Milton with Caviart Ally, the Goodtimes with Pilot Discretion, and Nassagaweya with Capt Midnight. Last year, he won the She's A Great Lady with Tall Drink Hanover in addition to the Milton with Caviart Ally. A chance meeting with trainer Noel Daley inspired McCarthy to leave Australia and head to the U.S. in 2007. In his third lifetime drive in the States, McCarthy piloted Daley's Took Hanover to a 1:49 win in the open at the Meadowlands.

TREACHEROUS REIGN

Treacherous Reign advanced to the Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace final by accepting a bye.

Treacherous Reign was fifth in her elimination and ninth in the final of the Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace. In 2019 she has won the Fan Hanover final at Woodbine Mohawk Park, a Pennsylvania Sire Stakes leg and a PA All-Stars division at Pocono, her Jugette elim at the Delaware County Fair, and her Bluegrass section at The Red Mile.

Alagna Racing LLC. (Tony Alagna) hasn't won a Breeders Crown to date, with a best finish of second with Wake Up Peter in the 2012 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace. Big Als Stables (Allan Saul) owned 2002 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace winner Ambro Amoretto and co-owned 2011 Breeders Crown Mare Trot champion Frenchfrysvinegar. Let It Ride Stables Inc. (Eric Cherry) and Parham co-owned 2016 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace champion Call Me Queen Be. Cherry also co-owned 2002 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Trot winner Pick Me Up via his Mentally Stable.

Tony Alagna, 47, is a three-time Breeders Crown winner. He got his most recent trophy in 2017 with Stay Hungry in the 2-year-old colt-and-gelding pace. Stay Hungry received the O'Brien Award as Canada's best 2-year-old male pacer. Alagna got his first Crown with 3-year-old male pacer Captaintreacherous in 2013 and added his second with 3-year-old male pacer Racing Hill in 2016.

A native of Illinois, Alagna followed his mom, Donna Lee, into the sport. He had a pony at the age of 3, was reading up on pedigrees at 9, and solely responsible for his first horse at 10. Soon after graduating from high school, Alagna was assisting his mom with her stable. He later worked for trainer Brian Pinske and, after getting a degree from Florida's Seminole College, as private trainer for Fox Valley Standardbreds in Illinois.

Dexter Dunn, 30, made his Breeders Crown debut in 2018, competing in one elimination. This is his first time in the finals. He won five eliminations this past weekend.

Dunn is in his first full season of driving in the U.S. after a record-setting career in New Zealand. A native of Christchurch, Dunn led New Zealand's premiership in wins for 10 consecutive years from 2008 through 2017. During that span, he won at least 200 races on six occasions and twice finished with 199. He was the first New Zealand driver to win at least 200 races in a season. Dunn was invited to drive in the U.S. last summer by trainer Chris Ryder, a longtime family friend. Dunn's top horse this year has been Bettor's Wish, a 3-year-old pacing colt trained and co-owned by Ryder.

White Birch Farm is sixth in the history of the Breeders Crown for earnings by a breeder with over \$3.7 million. They have bred three Breeders Crown champions and collected six trophies.

WARRAWEE UBEAUT

Warrawee Ubeaut won the lone Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace elimination. She made the front in the second quarter en route to a two length win in 1:50.3. It was her seventh straight victory.

"She's great. There's no other words to describe her," said winning driver Yannick Gingras. "She's perfect to drive. When I called on her at the top of the stretch, she was like coming out of her skin she was pacing so strong."

Warrawee Ubeaut won last year's Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Filly Pace and was the Dan Patch Award winner for the division. She has won the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship, Glen Garnsey, and Jugette this season.

Burke Racing Stable LLC. (Sylvia Burke) and Weaver Brusceci LLC. (Mark Weaver and Michael Brusceci) have won 11 and nine Breeders Crown trophies, respectively, making them some of the most successful owners in the history of the event. The J&T Sliva- Purnel & Libby group (Elizabeth Jones, J&T Silva Stables LLC., Purnel & Libby LLC.) won their first two Breeders Crowns last year with Warrawee Ubeaut and with Dorsoduro Hanover in the 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace. Jerry Silva is also a 13-time Crown winner either solely or in partnership with wife Theresa. Purnel & Libby LLC. also co-owned Percy Bluechip, winner of last year's Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace. Phil Collura has won two Breeders Crowns, the 2011 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace with Burke-trained Sweet Lou and last year with Warrawee Ubeaut.

Ron Burke, 50, is tied for second with Bob McIntosh for the most trophies in Breeders Crown history with 16. Jimmy Takter is the all-time leader with 34. Burke won three finals in 2018 with 3-year-old male pacer Dorsoduro Hanover, 3-year-old filly pacer Percy Bluechip, and 2-year-old filly pacer Warrawee Ubeaut.

He is one of six trainers to win at least two Breeders Crown finals in multiple years, with Jimmy Takter, Bob McIntosh, Steve Elliott, Brett Pelling and Trond Smedshammer.

Yannick Gingras, 40, is third among active drivers in Breeders Crown wins, with 21, and No. 6 all time in the series. He won a Breeders Crown in 2018 with Warrawee Ubeaut in the 2-year-old filly pace. In 2017, Gingras won four Crowns in a year for the second time in his career. He won the Open Trot with Hannelore Hanover, who became the first female to win the event since Moni Maker in 1998. Hannelore Hanover went on to be named Horse of the Year in the U.S. and Canada.

Warrawee Ubeaut was the first Breeders Crown champion for Rockwood, Ontario's Warrawee Farm. Their best finish prior to her victory in last year's 2-Year-Old Filly Pace was a pair of seconds with Mister Herbie in the 2012 Open Trot and the 2013 Open Trot.
