Profiles for 3-year-old filly pace

Notorious Pink (Captaintreacherous-She's A Hot Mess-American Ideal)



Compiling a record of 13-5-5-1 last season and banking \$276,081, Notorious Pink was ninth in last year's \$600,000 Breeders Crown final for freshman pacing fillies. Trained by Tony Alagna, Notorious Pink has faced the starter on 14 occasions in her sophomore season with a record of 3-0-1 and earned \$59,481 in purse money.

Notorious Pink was fourth in her \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination and one of her three victories this season was in the \$50,000 Kentucky Commonwealth Series final.

She was a \$35,000 purchase at the 2018 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale by Alagna And Grant Stable, Big Als Stables, Riverview Racing LLC and Fodera and Head Stable. Notorious Pink was bred by Riverview Breeding, Visonary Breeders and John A. Fodera.

It would be the ownership group's first Breeders Crown triumph. Alagna captured this event in 2013 with this filly's sire and her regular pilot is Andrew McCarthy who collected four Breeders Crown trophies in 2019.

Marsala Hanover (Captaintreacherous-Marinade Hanover-Bettor's Delight)



Trained by Hall of Fame conditioner Linda Toscano, Marsala Hanover sports a resume of 13-3-1-3 this year and has earned \$112,533. Owned by Let It Ride Stables, Bottom Line Racing, South Mountain Stables and Little E LLC, the filly was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms. This facility is tied with Brittany Farms for the most Breeders Crown triumphs from their progeny in the sport.

Marsala Hanover is a half-sibling to Money Shot Hanover (Art Major, \$254,238) and Alexis's Beach (Somebeachsomewhere, \$113,952). She was a \$100,000 yearling purchase at the 2018 Standardbred Horse Sale.

Scott Zeron, who guided Marion Marauder to a Triple Crown triumph in 2016, will be holding the lines.

Think Of Galaxies (So Surreal-Lighting D Dube-Western Ideal)



Think Of Galaxies is owned by Jonathan Klee Racing and Peter Kleinhans, who also bred her. The filly was fifth in her \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination on Oct. 23. She, however, was third in the \$100,000 Courageous Lady at MGM Northfield Park on Oct. 16 behind divisional leader Test Of Faith and world champion Oakwoodanabellair.

She was also second behind Test Of Faith in the \$214,000 Empire Breeders Classic on Aug. 29.

Think Of Galaxies would provide trainer John Mc Dermott with his first Breeders Crown victory. Mark MacDonald is the filly's regular pilot.

Shezafreaklikeme (Sweet Lou-Nf One Rose)



Shezafreaklikeme is owned by Chiodo Racing, who also bred her. The filly's mother is a full sister to past Stacy Chiodo star Mighty Young Joe, who Chiodo trained and drove throughout his 11-year career. The gelding earned \$537,279 lifetime and posted a best win time of 1:49.3 at age 11 in 2014. The triumph made Chiodo the first female driver in history with a sub-1:50 mile.

The New Jersey-based Chiodo, who has 124 lifetime driving wins, is enjoying a career year as a trainer and this filly has banked \$54,632 with a record of 22=2-4-4.

Shezafreaklikeme will be steered by Andy Miller who drove her in her elimination

Miller has four Breeders Crown triumphs in the bike.'

Grace Hill (Always B Miki-Western Silk-Western Terror)



With two world champions as her parents and her sire as the swiftest pacer on the planet this lady has a lot to live up to. Grace Hill is the fourth foal from her dam who captured the 2010 edition of the Jugette at the

Delaware County Fair Grounds. Grace Hill rebounded from a third-place finish in the \$207,000 Glen Garnesy Memorial at Red Mile on Oct. 10 to win her \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination on Oct. 23 at Meadowlands.

Trained by Richard "Nifty" Norman, Grace Hill is the 2021 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes champion. She also won the \$250,000 James Lynch Memorial on Aug. 21 and the \$97,550 Shady Daisy at Meadowlands on Aug. 7.

Now steered by Todd McCarthy, Grace Hill has earned \$713,985 and was purchased for \$75,000 under the name Always B Silky by owner Tom Hill.

Mackie Hanover (Captaintreacherous-Miss Kitty Hanover-Western Hanover)




Sixth in her \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination at Meadowlands on Oct. 23, Mackie Hanover has been knocking on the door for a big performance. Trained by Tom Fanning, the filly was a \$45,000 Standardbred Horse Sale purchase and a half-sibling to 2011 Cane Pace winner Lyonssomewhere.

Bred by Hanover Shoe Farms, Mackie Hanover is owned by Howard Taylor and Falcon Racing. She will be driven by Hall of Famer Tim Tetrick. Tetrick was the first driver to reach 8,000 wins at his age and drove Mackie Hanover's sire to victory in the Breeders Crown 2013 3-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace.

Mackie Hanover has a career record of 25-6-5-5 and has earned \$163,931.





Two-time Kentucky Sire Stakes champion, Blue Diamond Eyes is conditioned by Hall of Famer Ron Burke and driven by another Hall of Fame member in Yannick Gingras. The filly was third in her \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination and is a consistent performer.

Owned by Thomas Dillon and Scott Dillon, Blue Diamond Eyes was bred by Brittany Farms who tied Hanover Shoe Farms with the most victories in Breeders Crown history last year with winners Perfect Sting in the 2-Year-Old Colt and Gelding Pace final and co-fastest female trotter Manchego in the Open Mare Trot.

Blue Diamond Eyes has a record of 20-10-6-5 and has earned \$1.02 million.

Test Of Faith (Art Major-Cannae Cammie-Cam's Card Shark)



Trained by Brett Pelling, this filly has dominated her rivals throughout her career with a record of 23-20-3-0. She is a two-time New York Sire Stakes champion and enters this contest off a bye with a three-race win streak.

Owned by Melvin Segal, Kentuckiana Racing Stables and Eddie Gran, Test Of Faith is a half-sister to Alexis Faith (American Ideal, \$586,500) and Can't Beach That (Somebeachsomewhere, \$252,799)

This filly seeks to accomplish what her dam did not in capturing a Breeders Crown trophy. Cannae Cammie won her \$25,000 elimination in 2010 but was fourth in the \$500,000 final with Hall of Fame member Ron Pierce in the sulky.

Test Of Faith has earned more than \$1.05 million her career, defeated older rivals and would provide Hall of Famer David Miller with his 15th Breeders Crown trophy.

Fire Start Hanover (Somebeachsomewhere-Fit To Frame-Art Major)



This filly is the reigning Dan Patch Award winner and seeks her second crown in her sophomore season. Fire Start Hanover, trained by Richard "Nifty" Norman and guided by two-time driving champion Dexter Dunn

won the \$335,750 Fan Hanover final but has been a bridesmaid in the \$97,550 Shady Daisy final, the \$250,000 Lynch Memorial final, the \$207,000 Glen Garnsey Memorial final and in \$25,000 Breeders Crown elimination behind Grace Hill on Oct. 23.

Owned by Pinske Stables, David Hoese and Lawrence Means, Fire Start Hanover was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms and was purchased for \$105,000 at the 2019 Standardbred Horse Sale. She is a half-sister to Fabrice Hanover (Captaintreacherous-\$145,960).





Winner of this year's 152,280 Jugette final and Ontario Sire Stakes final, Scarlett Hanover received a bye for her Breeders Crown elimination and will go straight to the final.

The world champion has a 27-12-7-1 record and has earned \$718,856. She has competed primarily in Canada during her two-year career and was third in last year's Breeders Crown final for her age, sex and gait.
