- 1949—Miss Tilly was a straight heat winner. Miss Tilly and Martha Doyle 1-3 in the first heat and 1-4 in the summary.
- 1951—Scotch Rhythm, 19th in the first heat, rallied and finished second to Mainliner in the final, earning third in the summary.
- 1953—Helicopter, who finished 17th in the first heat, swept the next two to win the Hambletonian.
- 1954—Princess Rodney and Vicki Hanover 2-3 in heat one and 2-4 in the summary.
- 1956—Nimble Colby and Egyptian Princess 3-4 in the summary. The former was placed second in the first heat (she had finished third). Egyptian Princess was second to The Intruder in the second in the summary.
- 1957—Emily's Pride was a winner in three heats. She won the first and third heats and was 12th in the middle heat. Emily's Pride and Sandalwood finished 1-2 in the third heat and 1-4 in the final.
- 1959—Lady Belvedere third in the second and final heat.
- 1960—Elaine Rodney finished fifth in the summary after finishing second (beaten a nose) to Blaze Hanover in the first heat, third to Quick Song in the second heat and sixth to Hoot Frost in the third heat. (Blaze Hanover won the fourth and deciding heat.)
- 1962—Five of the 15 starters were fillies. Impish, third to A. C.'s Viking in the first heat and fifth to him in the final, was fourth in the summary.
- 1963—Elma was third in the summary to Speedy Scott. Buff Hanover was fifth in the summary.
- 1965—Armbro Flight was second in the summary after narrowly winning her third heat and losing (by a long neck) to Egyptian Candor in the fourth and deciding heat.
- 1966—Kerry Way was a straight heat winner, setting a two heat world record for three year old trotting fillies in the process.
- 1967—Speed Model finished second to Speedy Streak in the final and earned third in the summary.
- 1971—THE HAMBLETONIAN FILLY STAKE IS INAUGURATED.
- 1972—Delmonica Hanover was second in both heats to Super Bowl.
- 1973—Florinda was second to Flirth in the first heat, fifth to that one in the final and was second in the summary.
- 1974—Singaway Herbert was third to Christopher T. in the first heat.
- 1976—Armbro Regina, 17th in the first heat, was second in next heat won the third heat and finished third in the raceoff to Steve Lobell and Zoot Suit. She was third in the summary.
- 1979—Classical Way was fourth in the second and final heat and fourth in the summary.
- 1983—Duenna was a straight heat winner. Duenna and Winky's Gill 1-2 in the final heat and 1-3 in the summary. Duenna was the first filly to win The Hambletonian since 1966.
- 1986—Britelite Lobell finished 2*-3, third overall.
- 1989—Peace Corps finished 5-2-ro. She had been the prohibitive favorite coming off a 17 race win streak.
