- Finished sixth in final Hambo prep, the Reynolds, at the Meadowlands on July 27th.
- Finished a strong third in his Stanley Dancer division behind Swandre The Giant and Green Manalishi S on July 13th.
- Finished in a dead heat for fourth in his Beal elimination and failed to make the final.
- Took the second leg of the New Jersey Sires Stakes in a lifetime best of 1:54.2 and finished second in the Final behind Greenshoe on May 31st.
- Finished fourth in his Valley Victory Elimination and finished out his two year old campaign with a third place finish in the final at the Meadowlands.
- Broke his maiden in a leg of the Kindergarten at the Meadowlands on November 3rd.
- Made thirteen starts as a two year old earning \$209,425.
- David Miller, 53, won the 2012 Hambletonian Oaks with Personal Style.
- In the 2017 Hambletonian, he drove What The Hill, who crossed the finish line first but was disqualified for interference in the stretch. Miller had third-place finishes in 2015 with Uncle Lasse and 2013 with Corky.
- Miller's top moments in 2018 came with Courtly Choice, winning the Meadowlands Pace and Little Brown Jug, and with Stag Party in the Metro Pace. He also won the Canadian Pacing Derby with Horse of the Year McWicked.

- A 2014 inductee into the Hall of Fame, Miller ranks No. 2 all time in purses, with \$236 million, and has finished among the top five in earnings 19 of the past 20 years.
- Miller is No. 5 all-time in wins, with more than 12,700.
- He was the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Driver of the Year in 2016, 2015 and 2003.
- In 2003, Miller led the sport in purses and drove No Pan Intended to the Pacing Triple Crown and Horse of the Year honors. In 2016, Miller was the driver of Horse of the Year Award winner Always B Miki, who paced the fastest mile in harness racing history when he won in 1:46 at Lexington's Red Mile.
- In 2015, Miller set a record with five Breeders Crown wins in a single year.
- Miller, who received the 1993 Rising Star Award from the U.S. Harness Writers Association, was already a standout in his native Ohio when he headed to the East Coast in the late 1990s. He captured multiple driving titles at the Meadowlands Racetrack in the early 2000s and has been a force on the Grand Circuit ever since he made the move.
- Nifty Norman, 58, is a two-time winner of the Hambletonian Oaks, training 2012 winner Personal Style and 2013 champion Bee A Magician.
- Bee A Magician was Horse of the Year in 2013. She was 17-for-17 and earned \$1.54 million. Her earnings were a record for a 3-year-old filly trotter.
- A native of New Zealand, where he worked with horses after leaving school, Norman came to California in 1985 to visit his friend, trainer Ross Croghan, and ended up staying to help with Croghan's stable. He later worked with Brett Pelling before starting his own stable.
- Norman has won more than 1,200 races and \$33 million in purses. His stable has surpassed \$1 million for 14 consecutive years, including 2019.
- Other top horses over the years for Norman include Dan Patch Award-winner Poof She's Gone and millionaire Beatgoeson Hanover.
- With Marion Marauder, the then 27-year-old Zeron was the second-youngest driver to win the Hambletonian and youngest driver to win a harness racing Triple Crown, either trotting or pacing.
- His sire Father Patrick was the prohibitive favorite going into the 2015 Hambletonian. He was five-for-five that year and riding a 15-race win streak dating back to the previous year, he drew the outside post 10. Father Patrick became the shortest-priced horse to not capture the trotting classic when he went offstride for the first time in his 17-start career.

- Co-Owner Tom Pontone has two previous hambletonian wins, Market Share (2012), Muscle Hill (2009).
